	1893	Bridgeport Town Company brought from Wise County Coal Company and began to sell lots June 3, 1893.
	1913-1928	H. H. Hardin Hardware Bldg. (1924 ad Undertaking & Building Material) had the entire building. He also had the lumber Company located on Stevens Street. The Sanborn map shows H. H. Hardin Hardware was at this location.
	1923	I. M. Kendall Tax roll owned the building (he may be the one who divided the building. Maybe he bought the building from H. H. Hardin and then leased it back to him. Kendall may have been the one to divide the building.
	1930's?	1003B City Meat Market (picture, but no other information). I Wonder if this could have been L. M. Pate that Biran Denton (Mary Caram Denton's grandson) remembers.
	1932-1936?	1003A?? Hines & Embry (Cathy Hines and Ethel Hutchinson had a dress shop)
	1928?-1966?	1003A Robert L. Coffman Shoe shop (Building divided in half) (Robert L. Coffman had a heart attack in the shop per daughter Fay (married Pollard Jetter) (born 1883 died 1979). Paula Buckner Granddaughter called Dec. 11, 2003, to see if we had information. She said he suffered a broken hip and closed the store. Wonder which memory is right? J.D. Coffman married Ruth Parish (Reba Boase sister).
	1980-1985	1003A Mr. Teddley (Boot Shop) (Talk to Beaumont Brown to see if he has further Information on Mr. Teddley. Sold the business to Mr. Mann 1985.
	1985-1990	1003A Mann Shoe repair (L. W. & Pat Mann) 940 466 7940 Mr. Mann is the father of Rusty Mann. He bought the business from Mr. Teddley. Rented the building from R. L. Taylor. He also had a shoe shop in Decatur 1989-to 1995 which he sold and moved to Pagosa Springs, Colorado. Stayed there for about three years until Health problems made them return to Texas. They live in Decatur at this time (2006)
	1936-1940?	1003B Natley Meat Market (Leonard L. Nately) lived on Main St. in 1920 census and on Halsell St. in 1930. (on one side of divided building)
	1946-1947?	1003B Ada Jewell Holt had a gift shop in the front of the building and Mr. Holt had a plumbing shop in the back until he moved up the street to 1107 Halsell by 1955 per Tel Dr ad. Mrs. Holt died in 1949
	1945	R. L. Taylor owned per tax roll
	1955	1003B Ludwig's Radio & TV Svc. (renter)
	1959_1979	1003B Chapman Jr. TV service 1003 B (he was in the back part of the store and Mr. Potts was in the front. renter
	1961-1966	1003B Sam Potts Watch & Jewelry "Time Shop" renter
	1970-?	1003A Traders Nook Pawn Shop (Freddie Thompkins) his mother was Nannet Boaz. 1003A Friedilia Boaz Pawn Shop this is probably the same as Freddie Thompkins. Was he in 1003A or 1003B????

- 1981-1982 **1003B** Hair etc. (Judy Carpenter) Electrolysis by Jean Tupper. renter
- 1981-1982 **1003A** Mr. Allen had a boot repair according to Judy Carpenter
- 1987 **1003A** Bob Mishnick had an art studio here for some time according to Melanie Singleton. He must have been in **1003B**.
- 1991-? **1003A** Nancy's shoe shop. This was Beaumont Brown's uncle. He named the business after his wife.
- 1992-1994 **1003A** Brown 's Boot & Saddle Repair bought the business from Nancy's shoe shop. He rented from R. L. Taylor until Sharon Wells bought the building and then rented from them until they started Serendipity House.
- 1994-1998 **1003A and 1003B** Serendipity House (Judy Armstrong, Jean Early, Merle Foster, Sharon Wells) (rented the building from Mr. & Mrs. Taylor in September in 1994.) Sharon & Ray Wells bought the entire building in February of 1995 from the Taylors. They operated Serendipity House in the entire building until the end of 1998.
